



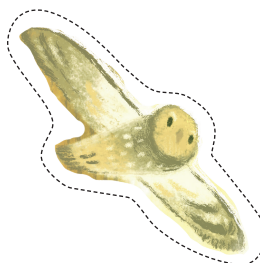
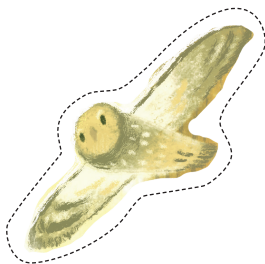
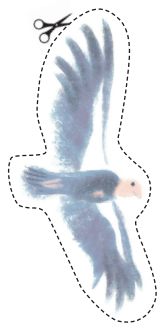
Let's Go Sightseeing!
