GREEN: A word used to describe someone who is kind to the Earth and protects it from harm.

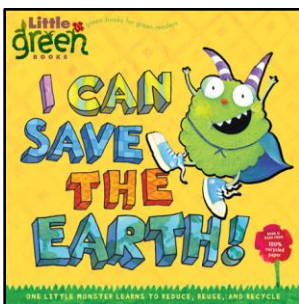
LITTER: To throw garbage away in places it does not belong, like on the ground or out of a car window.
