

Pre-reading activities: Before reading **Flower Girl Dreams** complete some or all of the activities below to peak interest in the story, as well as to increase comprehension, reading, and predicting skills. The next page has a pre-reading activity to try as well.

- 1. **Flower Girl Dreams** is a great springboard for discussing budgets. Discuss how most people must only buy what they can afford. Use a white board to list things that they need to buy to live. See what things on the list are important and what things could be taken off if the budget didn't permit it.
- 2. Give students a pretend budget and let them plan a party. The winner is the student who has the best party and spends the least. Encourage them to be creative! If possible, plan a real party! (You might also use the enclosed worksheet).



FUN WAYS TO LEARN VOCABULARY WORDS FOR FLOWER GIRL DREAMS
