




FUN WAYS TO LEARN VOCABULARY WORDS FOR FAIRY CHASE

- Put a small layer of play sand in an old cookie sheet with sides. Let children trace their vocabulary words in the sand for a great tactile experience.
- If your playground has a paved area, let children write their vocabulary words with chalk onto the pavement.
- Have a word race. Call out the word and let students race to find the word in the chapter.
- Let students stand up and spell the words in the air, making them as big as possible.
- Let children make two cards for each word. Shuffle them and place them face down. Students can take turns making ‘matches’. The one with the most matches wins!
- Write the word on a board and spell it with students. Turn the board away and erase a letter. Can the students guess the missing letter?
