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SUGGESTED EVENT SCHEDULE ... for your own safety!

One Month Ahead

- Pick a date and time for your event.
- Check your inventory of *The Spiderwick Chronicles:* Book #1: The Field Guide, Book #2: The Seeing Stone, Book #3: Lucinda's Secret, and Book #4: The Ironwood Tree, and place your order ... in red ink!

Three to Lour Weeks Ahead

- Promote the event in your store calendar, newsletter, or local newspaper. (Avoid pixie publications at all costs!)
- Notify your customers, local schools, libraries, and after-school groups, etc.
- Make a list of all the materials that you might need, such as crayons, pencils, tape, leaves, string, shoeboxes, etc.
- MOST IMPORTANTLY, begin collecting faerie-protection devices:
 - 1. Gather ANYTHING RED! (Faeries are repelled by the color red.)
 - 2. Remind staff to turn articles of clothing inside out. (This seemingly bizarre gesture repels faerie pranks.)
 - 3. Find a twig from an oak tree, an ash tree, and a thorn tree that grow close together, and bind them together with red thread. Carry them on your person(s).
- Make sure you have enough staff handy to help out with leading games, such as **In Pursuit of Spiderwick...** and for warding off nosy phookas.

One to Two Weeks Ahead

- Photocopy the reproducible activity sheets. (Once again, we are not responsible for paper jams.)
- Make arrangements to have materials listed above for the event.

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Event Day

- Double-check handouts and have them waiting nearby for easy distribution.
- Faerie-proof your event area with suggestions listed above.
- Set out game boards and game pieces.
- Once guests arrive, read your favorite excerpt from one of The Spiderwick Chronicles books.
- Play the In Pursuit of Spiderwick game.
- Read another favorite Spiderwick excerpt to the group.
- Then pass out the **Morph into a Wood Elf** activity, **Dress a Sprite** activity, and other reproducible activity sheets. Allow children (and other guest creatures) to color on their own.
- Hand out trading cards approximately 15 to 20 minutes before the event ends, giving kids a chance to trade if they'd like. (Note: Remind children NOT to trade with any goblins that may have snuck in. Goblins will eat trading cards.)
